DIRECTIONS to the Holiday Party. A Stunning Demo of Contemporary Chinese Ink Brush Painting





A master of Chinese ink brush painting, local artist Susan Frame gave us a comprehensive introduction to her art, art materials and painting techniques during our November meeting. Susan, whose studio is in the California Building, teaches this medium in Minneapolis as well as in Grand Marais, passing on her learning from studies in Taiwan. South Korea and China. She is known, exhibits, and sells internationally. Susan works with Xuan paper, a soft and fine grained paper (made of mulberry, bamboo, and other natural materials) that readily absorbs liquid and which allows ink to spread and blur. She demonstrated a brush-loading technique that enables the artist to load a brush with two or more tones or colors and which results in tonal variety in a brush stroke. She used Chinese ink (India ink has shellac in it which is not desirable) and she showed how the ink reacts on various papers both sized and unsized. She also demonstrated how you can paint on the back side of the paper to achieve certain tonal and textural results on the front side. She painted a lotus to show how to use the front, side and heel of the brush to achieve beautiful marks. In the same painting, she also dumped color from a dish directly onto the paper to color the blue-green leaves of the plant (see above, left). Finally, she did a second painting (above, right) using a contemporary pouring technique by pouring paint onto several successive layers of paper laid on top of one another and which, when dried separately, might produce interesting backgrounds for several paintings. Altogether, a superb introduction to this ancient and contemporary art!
