Fix it or Flunk It?

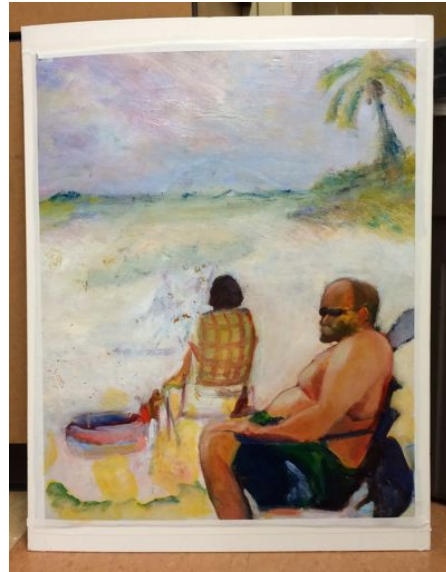

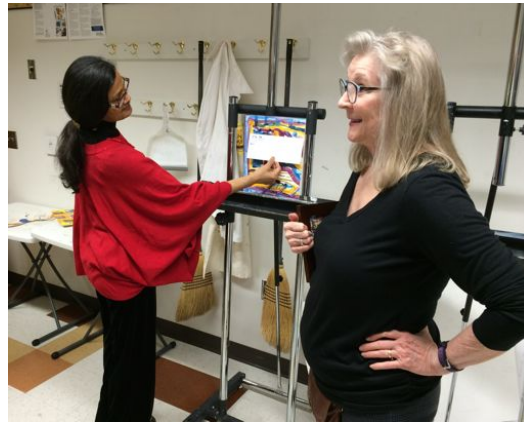
