

Fred will demonstrate his use of 4 colors in his paintings. The 3 primary colors Red, Yellow, Blue and also Bunt Umber. Fred says "This is really a great way to learn how to mix color." Fred will bring examples of his work to show and talk about supplies needed for this process.

September Meeting: Barb Björnson's Birds

Barb Björnson started a pastel society 25 years ago on the coldest night in February. Instead of the empty room she anticipated, she was greeted by 45 interested people and thus began the Lake Country Pastel Society.

Later she took a class in botanical watercolors although she thought she "hated" watercolor. Surprise! They only painted one painting in the whole six-week class. She learned to control the medium and she loved it!

She knew she wanted to make birds and took a class where they carved the bird bodies from Styrofoam. The Styrofoam went everywhere and was way too messy, so Barb started problem-solving, something she would do again and again while developing her bird-making process. She eventually developed a method of making an armature from wire strenghtened with expoxy, stuffing it with foil, and taping it together with with strapping tape. The legs and feet also start with wire.

Next, papier-mâché is applied and smoothed with a sculpting tool. The layers dry overnight in front of a

fan. More coats of papier-mâché are added until it reaches the desired shape. When dry she files and sands it until smooth. If its not smooth the paper feathers won't lay correctly. Then she is ready to paint the bird body with acrylic.

Learning watercolor paid off, as she now uses 90 pound watercolor paper for her carefully cut feathers. She allows streaks in the paint as it adds variation in the feathers. Each feather is cut out individually. A spring-loaded scissors eases the process of cutting. Some feathers are painted again to highlight the edges. Feathers are glued to the body starting at the bottom and moving up. Vinyl gloves and cheap paintbrushes are recommended to apply the glue. The glue takes about 15 minutes to set, if removal is necessary it might need to be chiseled off.

After 6 years of working on her process, she thought she was the only one creating birds like this. But one day on Instagram she was delighted to find a few others creating birds.

This exacting process might seem tedious to others but makes Barb completely happy. She loves thinking about the birds and how everything is going to fit together. She says at this time in her life all she needs is to enjoy what she's doing.

You may enter two artworks with a maximum width of 40" including the frame (height can be more). It will be a juried show which means it is possible that not all of the entries will be accepted. Entry fees are \$15 for one entry and \$25 for two entries. You must be a member to enter the show and have paid your dues for the current calendar year (due September

1, 2022). If you joined before the Spring show you still have to pay dues for September 2022 - August 2023.

Exhibition dates: November 11, 2022 - January 7, 2023

Requirements: All work must be original, created solely by the artist, framed and wired for hanging (no sawtooth hangers). Gallery wrapped paintings must have painted edges. Drawings, hand pulled prints and watercolors must be under glass, plexiglass, varnished or waxed. Photographs & hand pulled prints are acceptable. You must be a current member of MAA. The show will be juried and entering the show does not guarantee acceptance. Works previously displayed in MAA exhibitions or at the Ames Center are not acceptable. Maximum size is 40" wide (height can be greater within reason). One or two works can be entered. The Ames Center receives a 25% commission on all sales. Make your own label and place on the back, upper left side of your artwork or where appropriate on 3D work.
