April Meeting, Dan Petrov Demo





Our April meeting at the Bloomington Art Center was a treat, especially for those of us who paint or draw in a realistic style. Dan Petrov entertained us with his speed and accuracy of painting while talking. He imparted a lot of knowledge and pointers... and witty remarks.

He started his still life very quickly (compared to me), by drawing with his paintbrush. To aid his accuracy, he drew the shapes with only straight lines. Curves were defined with a series of straight lines at the correct angles.

When he started putting in color, he suggested we identify the basic color and make adjustments right on the canvas. To help you get the right color, ask yourself, "Is it bright or muted? Should it be warmer or cooler? What is the value?"

To keep the colors bright and lively, he suggested adjusting the values using analogous colors if possible, rather than just reaching for black or white.

To soften edges, you can drag some of the dark into the light, but not the other way around. You can also tap a dry brush on the edge you want softer.

Petrov suggests finishing a painting by concentrating on an area of high contrast in values, colors, and temperatures (a passage) until you get a victory over it. Then go on to the next until you can declare victory over that one."


